ORDER

On January 21, 2021, the Superintendent of Police filed with the Police Board of the City of Chicago charges against Police Officer Milton Storey, Star No. 2703 (hereinafter referred to as “Respondent”), recommending that the Respondent be discharged from the Chicago Police Department for violating several Rules of Conduct (a copy of the charges is attached as Exhibit A).

On February 5, 2021, the Superintendent filed a motion to withdraw the charges against the Respondent without prejudice because the Respondent resigned his position with the Chicago Police Department. The Police Board has considered the Superintendent’s motion.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Superintendent’s motion is **granted**, and the proceedings before the Police Board are terminated.

Exhibit A

Charges

Attached are the charges filed with the Police Board by the Superintendent of Police. The public is reminded that the filing of charges is not evidence of guilt. The accused officer is presumed innocent and is entitled to a fair hearing at which the Superintendent has the burden of proving guilt by a preponderance of the evidence. In this case, the accused officer resigned from the Chicago Police Department prior to a hearing on the charges.

CHARGES AGAINST POLICE OFFICER MILTON STOREY

Police Officer Milton Storey, Star No. 2703, (“Officer Storey”) is charged with violating the following rules contained in Article V of the Rules and Regulations of the Chicago Police Department (“Department”), which were in full force and effect on the date of the alleged violations:

- Rule 1: Violation of any law or ordinance.
- Rule 2: Any action or conduct which impedes the Department’s efforts to achieve its policy and goals or brings discredit upon the Department.
- Rule 3: Any failure to promote the Department’s efforts to implement its policy or accomplish its goals.
- Rule 8: Disrespect to or maltreatment of any person, while on or off duty.

SPECIFICATIONS

1. On or about August 26, 2018, on the Chicago Riverwalk at or near 112 East Wacker Drive, Chicago, Illinois, while on duty, Officer Storey grabbed and/or rubbed and/or stroked [REDACTED]’s arm, and/or placed his arm around her, and/or rubbed her lower back, and/or grabbed her wrist and/or arm and walked her toward a Chicago Police Department boat on the Chicago River. Officer Storey thereby violated:
 - a. Rule 1, which prohibits violating any law or ordinance, by violating section 5/12-3 of the Illinois Criminal Code of 2012, 720 ILCS 5/12-3 (“Battery”);
 - b. Rule 2, which prohibits any action or conduct which impedes the Department’s efforts to achieve its policy and goals or brings discredit upon the Department;
 - c. Rule 3, which prohibits failing to promote the Department’s efforts to implement its policy or accomplish its goals; and/or
 - d. Rule 8, which prohibits disrespecting or maltreating any person, while on or off duty.
2. On or about August 26, 2018, on the Chicago Riverwalk at or near 112 East Wacker Drive, Chicago, Illinois, while on duty, Officer Storey stated the following to [REDACTED]: “I like your skinny ass” and/or “do you have a boyfriend” and/or “when are you going to dump him [your boyfriend]?” and/or “are you tired of him [your boyfriend] yet?” or words to that effect. Officer Storey thereby violated:
 - a. Rule 2, which prohibits any action or conduct which impedes the Department’s efforts to achieve its policy and goals or brings discredit upon the Department;
 - b. Rule 3, which prohibits failing to promote the Department’s efforts to implement its policy or accomplish its goals; and/or
 - c. Rule 8, which prohibits disrespecting or maltreating any person, while on or off duty.

Based on the foregoing charges and specifications, the Superintendent recommends that Police Officer Milton Storey, Star Number 2703, be discharged from the Chicago Police Department.
